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Foundation funds over \$36,000 in Learning Grants for Prairie Spirit students

Innovative learning opportunities for Prairie Spirit students are being supported by over \$36,000 in Learning Grants from the Prairie Spirit Schools Foundation.

The Foundation's Learning Grants are designed to support students in Prairie Spirit School Division, with an emphasis on student engagement and relevant learning opportunities.

Applications for Learning Grants opened in the fall, with a focus on enhancing student engagement by empowering young people to explore their passions and create change in their classrooms, their schools and their community. Following a rigorous application process, the Foundation approved nine submissions from teachers and administrators and provided funds to schools throughout the Division.

"We are just thrilled to fund these very important programs and to be able to support new and innovative learning opportunities. In just over one year, we have given more than \$76,000 to the schools of Prairie Spirit School Division" said Denise Kendrick, Fund Development Manager of the Prairie Spirit Schools Foundation. This is why we fundraise and why we need the support of our community, to ensure that we can continue building our grant pool for years to come!"

The Foundation approved applications where the learning environment supported students to collaborate within and outside the classroom, learning side by side.

The Prairie Spirit Schools Foundation was established in 2014 to engage partners in public education to enrich opportunities for students to become contributing citizens and learners for life. The Foundation encourages and facilitates community and corporate support and involvement in public education.
