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Foundation funds \$39,000 in Learning Grants for Prairie Spirit students

\$39,000 in Learning Grants from the Prairie Spirit Schools Foundation will support innovative learning opportunities for Prairie Spirit students this year. The Foundation recently announced the recipients of this year's Learning Grants.

The Foundation's Learning Grants are designed to support students in Prairie Spirit School Division, with an emphasis on student engagement and relevant learning opportunities.

Applications for Learning Grants opened in June, with a focus on enhancing student engagement by empowering young people to explore their passions and create change in their classrooms, their schools and their community.

Following a rigorous application process, the Foundation approved thirteen submissions from students, teachers and administrators and provided funds to schools throughout the Division.

"We are just thrilled to fund and support new and innovative learning opportunities. Since February 2017, the Foundation has provided over \$106,000 to Prairie Spirit schools," said Denise Kendrick, Fund Development Manager of the Prairie Spirit Schools Foundation.

"We are looking forward to hearing how these grants will impact our students. This is why we exist as a Foundation. Without the support of our partners, sponsors and fundraiser participants, opportunities for our students such as these learning grants would not be possible. With increased and continued donor support, we will be able to fund more grants in the future." Explained Bonnie Hope, Foundation Board Chair.

The Foundation approved applications where the proposed learning environment supported students to collaborate within and outside the classroom, learning side by side.

The Prairie Spirit Schools Foundation was established in 2014 to engage partners in public education to enrich opportunities for students to become contributing citizens and learners for life. The Foundation encourages and facilitates community and corporate support and involvement in public education.
